In answering this question, your job is to clearly and concisely exposit the argument in your own words. You should be careful to (not necessarily in this order):

- Indicate what the **conclusion** of the argument is supposed to be
- Discuss at least one of the considerations that is meant to **support** that conclusion
- Make clear or explain **how** those considerations are supposed to support that conclusion
- If you still have space, briefly suggest why that conclusion might matter

(Basically, imagine you're contributing to a Wikipedia article on the control argument in order to make it clear for readers who've never heard of it.)
